An intimate look at our national symbol

We see them every winter, perched in trees along the Mississippi River and



diving into the water for their lunch – and now we'll find out a lot more about our national bird, the bald eagle, from our March 10 speaker, Janet Ahlstrom Moline.

After growing up in Connecticut along Long Island Sound, where she is "happy to report the return of ospreys to the wetlands," Moline came to Rock Island where she earned bachelor and master's degrees at Augustana College. She wrote her master's thesis on "The Bald Eagle in the Upper Mississippi Valley," and has continued to study the bird and the natural world in general as a teacher of global biology (a course she created) at Rock Island High School. She retired from teaching in 2005.

Winner of numerous teaching awards, she continues a commitment to nature as the chair of the Citizens to Preserve Black Hawk Park Foundation and a member of the Earth Keeper task force at Trinity Lutheran Church, Moline. She and her husband Norm, a professor of geography at Augustana, are the parents of two adult children.
