Update on latrine project in Nicaragua



On the day before Thanksgiving, we'll get an update on the project to construct 100 latrines in four villages in the municipality of Xinoteca, Nicaragua. Presenters for this program are Rotarians **Bill**

Burress, Davenport, and Jim Peterson, Iowa City.

The area has been regarded as the poorest region in one of the poorest countries in Central America. The latrines have greatly improved sanitary conditions for the people, reducing illness and disease and improving the quality of their lives.

Bettendorf Rotary has a connection to this project: **Bernie Vogel** hosted a Xinoteca exchange student under the CASS program a few years ago. Today, she is a Rotarian who is actively involved in a local volunteer organization to help make projects happen.

Burress has been an active member of the Rotary Club of Davenport for 30 years, and is the immediate past president of the club. He currently serves on the club's board of directors and on the World Community Service Matching Grants subcommittee of District 6000. Since Peterson became a Rotarian in 2000 he has been active in various international projects in Mexico and Central America.

Heart surgeon reports on Trinity cardiac care

Dr. Bryan Foy, medical director of open heart surgery at Trinity Regional Health Systems, reported on the state of cardiac surgery at Trinity during the Nov. 18 meeting.



Heart disease is the

No. 1 cause of death in the United States for both men and women, and the disease afflicts both genders about equally in Trinity's cardiac practice, Dr. Foy said. In questioning after his presentation, he listed the chief risk factors: obesity, smoking, insufficient exercise – in essence, the modern American lifestyle.

Trinity performs some 4,000 cardiac procedures, according to Foy, ranging from angioplasty to angioplasty with the insertion of stents to keep arteries open to coronary artery bypass surgeries. The hospital's heart program has been ranked "in the top 10 percent of hospitals in the United States for overall cardiac services for 2010," by HealthGrades, an

independent national health-care rating organization.

Foy heads a team of 26 cardiac specialists – Cardiac Surgery Associates, S.C. – which includes nine surgeons who practice at Trinity and both practice and teach at Loyola University Stritch School of Medicine and the university's Medical Center in Chicago.
