Grubbs: 'Participate in Iowa Caucuses'

Christmas will hardly be over – and Bowl games will still be on TV – when the Iowa Caucuses, first in the nation, kick off the 2012 year-long political season on

Jan. 3. One of the people in the thick of it, Republican political consultant **Steve Grubbs** of Victory Enterprises, Davenport, provided a



bit of a look behind those political scenes at the Dec. 7 meeting.

"Why participate in the Iowa Caucuses?" the former Iowa chairman of the Herman Cain campaign asked. The caucuses offer an opportunity for any candidate to "get a foot in the door" and be considered as a candidate for president without having to spend huge sums of money to campaign in the state, he said. And the relatively small number of participants – about 100,000 out of all the eligible voters in Iowa – means each individual at the caucus "has a powerful opportunity to participate in choosing the next leader of the most powerful nation on Earth," he added. He characterized the caucuses as "the closest thing to participatory democracy."

Grubbs spent six weeks as Iowa chairman of the Cain campaign, having been recruited in October. "And I ran it into the ground," he joked ruefully, noting that Cain had topped the polls of likely Republican voters when he was hired, but had dropped to just 8% by the time he suspended his campaign amid growing accusations. As for the outcome now, Grubbs said, "It'll come down to Newt (former U.S. Rep. Newt Gingrich) and Mitt (former Massachusetts Gov. Mitt Romney)."
