We'll hear from Iowa's lieutenant governor



Our scheduled speaker at the Sept. 14 meeting is Iowa Lt. Gov. **Kim Reynolds**. She was elected to that office in 2010 as Gov. Terry Branstad's running mate.

Before seeking statewide office,

Reynolds represented a southwestern Iowa district in the Iowa Senate for two years. Earlier, she had been elected Clarke County Treasurer, 1994-2008. In 2000, she served as president of the Iowa State Treasurers Association. She later worked on a three-person policy team that helped implement the Iowa State County Treasurers Association website. In 2004, Reynolds received the Victor Martinelli "Outstanding County Treasurer in the United States" award.

A native of St. Charles, in Madison County, Iowa, Reynolds and her husband have three adult children and four grandchildren.

Davenport home to Iowa patent library

Davenport's Library, on Sept. 8, has become Iowa's only Patent and Trademark Depository Library, and its director, **LaWanda Roudebush**, told us all about it at the Sept. 7 meeting.



When the Des Moines library had to give up the PTDL for budgetary reasons, Roudebush acquired it, because "it helps our business community," she said. Many patent attorneys practice in the Quad Cities – including many at the Rock Island Arsenal, John Deere and the New Ventures Center, she said, and having that facility in the QC helps their work substantially. The U.S. Patent and Trademark Office provides the QC's PTDL with databases and software, official manuals, handbooks and search tools to provide resources and assistance for Iowa's patent and trademark clientele.

The PTDL at the Davenport Library is one of only 81. The next closest ones are in Chicago and Minneapolis. Its reference librarians are being trained to help anyone who will need its services.

→ Rotary-in-Motion Challenge / Run With Carl. **Dick Schillig**



recognized all the volunteers who made this year’s RWC a success. He also reported final RIM team miles and Strider of the Week awards: **Kurt Lokenvitz**



(“Gears in Motion”) – the team walked 2,708 total RIM miles; **Rick Hartsock** is the week’s Strider. Kurt chipped in \$100 – for his team’s 90 bonus miles + his son’s 10 bonus miles for running with Carl. **Jonna Schuler** (“Racy Rotarians”) – after matching Kurt’s donation, she named **Greg Blaske** as her Strider; adding 663 miles in its last week, her team totaled 4,031 for the contest. **Kevin Kraft** (“Mile High Club”) – kept the lead in steps to win the RIM Challenge – and the coveted trophy – with 4,704 miles, or “more than 10 million steps,” Kevin said in accepting the cup. He thanked Dick and Juanita Schillig for their “incredible legacy to Carl.” Only 361 days to the next RWC – Sept. 3, 2012.
