U of I Provost Barry Butler to speak



P. Barry Butler, executive vice president and provost, University of Iowa, will be the guest speaker at our Oct. 19 meeting.

Butler was appointed provost in May 2011 after serving as interim provost since October 2010. Before that appointment, he was dean of the UI College of Engineering, where he holds the rank of full professor in the Department of Mechanical and Industrial Engineering.

He earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in aeronautical engineering and his Ph.D. in mechanical engineering all from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. He joined the University of Iowa faculty in 1984.

Butler is active in a number of aerospace-related instructional and research activities at UI. He currently serves on the boards of several state and national technology-based organizations.

Teaching kids about free enterprise

"You as business people understand how important it is that you do what you do," said **Barbara VenHorst**, president of Junior Achievement of the Heartland, at the Oct. 12 meeting.

"Our government and economy are in a mess," she continued, with this generation of kids seeing congressional gridlock, foreclosures and layoffs as "normal." In this setting, the mission of Junior Achievement – teaching kids how the free enterprise system works – is very important, so they'll be ready for global competition, she said.

JA provides lessons – taught by experienced business persons, who interject real-world knowledge into the classroom – in financial literacy,

readiness for the world of work and entrepreneurship, VenHorst said.

Junior Achievement of the Heartland works with some 56,000 students, kindergarten-grade 12, in 260 schools in 24 counties in Iowa, Illinois and Wisconsin. About 3,700 volunteers from the business communities in that area teach the students, she said.
