Here's Frank's description of the program – and the experience behind it:

"It's actually a little more than 'A Walk in the Woods.' I'd sort of call it 'A Walk in the Woods for the Truly Insane' when you intend to backpack and camp outside for the weekend in subzero conditions in the middle of nowhere.

"Essentially, the presentation is about winter camping in northern Wisconsin (Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest to be exact). It's actually quite a profound experience. My brother-in-law, Michael Selburg – Mike is the minister at First Presbyterian Church in Morrison, Ill. – and I choose a weekend in January, drive to Nicolet, jam on the backpacks and make for the backcountry. We emerge several days later with all body parts intact.

"Sometimes the weather has been quite balmy... 30-plus in the daytime. Other times it has been very dangerous... minus 25 ground temperature. Always, though, the scenery is extraordinarily serene and peaceful.

"Mike and I will talk about what it's like to survive outside in extreme cold temperatures. We'll also talk about our gear (we'll have some of it there) and WHY we do this.

"The program has little, if anything, to do with Rotary, but I suppose it might be a little change of pace, which I hope people will enjoy."
