Iowa American chief to present overview



The president of Iowa American Water, Davenport, Randy A. Moore, will speak to us at the Jan. 27 meeting about the operation and

history of the utility that provides fresh water to the Iowa Quad Cities. His presentation will explain the current water treatment process, as well as a brief history of Iowa American and operations at the East River Station.

Iowa American, the largest investorowned water and wastewater utility in Iowa, provides clean water to about 200,000 customers. Before coming to the Quad Cities, Moore directed operations for Ohio American Water, Marion, which also served about 200,000 people. Since 1979, he has held leadership roles at several American Water operations in Indiana and Ohio. Iowa American Water is a wholly owned subsidiary of American Water. Founded in 1886, with headquarters in Voorhees, N.J., the company employs more than 7,000 people who provide services to 15 million customers in 32 states and Ontario, Canada.
