## Glass heads Iowa's Dept. of Education



Our speaker at the Aug. 24 meeting will be Dr. **Jason Glass**, director of the Iowa Department of Education, which he has pledged “will focus on... demonstrating... leadership,

promoting innovation in education and acting as a servant to schools and communities in Iowa” as the department works “... to restore Iowa’s tradition as a national leader in education....”

Jason taught at the high school and university levels in Kentucky before moving to Colorado where he advocated for students with disabilities and “helped develop an early-childhood education quality-rating system....” He was director of human resources for Eagle County schools in Colorado. In 2010 as a consultant he helped schools in Tennessee and Ohio implement the Race to the Top program.

## Grassley sees cuts in 3 major areas

**U.S. Sen. Chuck Grassley**, R-Iowa, the guest speaker at our Aug. 17 meeting, said that significant debt reduction cannot be achieved without cuts in defense, Social Security and Medicare. At the same time, he said he was committed to preserving those programs – but with changes. He said he hopes the so-called “super-committee” of 12 legislators, drawn equally from both parties in the House and Senate, can find common ground to begin those changes.

As for defense, the senator said the same policy has guided the forces since World War II, but it “needs to be flexible,” and able to respond to “the wars of the future.”

However the debt issues are resolved, he said, it must be the result of a bipartisan effort. Although he showed charts that he said showed that raising the highest

marginal tax rate has not increased federal revenue in the past, he disagreed with many in his party by saying, “We should close most or all tax loopholes” – with the possible exception of those affecting charitable giving and home mortgages. He advocated shrinking federal spending to 19% of Gross Domestic Product – it has risen to 24% in recent years.

On his way to the rostrum, the senator exchanged comments with guest **Ed Brown**, who earlier had thanked BRC for awarding him a scholarship. As he closed his remarks, Ed had quipped, “I’d better sit down – I think you’d rather hear the senator talk.” In his remarks, Sen. Grassley quipped, “Maybe you would prefer to hear Mr. Brown talk – after all Congress’ popularity only stands at 15%.”
