When it comes to alpaca competition, they've traveled as far as Ohio and Oklahoma to show the animals. George Daugherty, who arranged this program, met the Delaneys at an open house event where the public can view and learn about the alpaca.

Everything you wanted to know about eagles

Beginning her presentation with the good news, "Eagles are doing very well, thanks to the Endangered Species Act," **Janet Ahlstrom Moline**, our March 10 speaker, regaled us with all sorts of information about the National Bird. A sample:

- → There are bald eagle nests in this area, and some of the birds spend all summer here.
- → Eagles were never in danger of extinction, but they were *extirpated* from Iowa and Illinois.
- → Bald eagles have all-white heads and tails when they're mature able to reproduce at about 4-5 years.
- → The need to conserve energy can explain many of the bird's habits; for example, they mate for life (no need to "court" each year), they occupy the same nest year after year (no wonder they weigh up to *a ton!*).



→ Mama Eagle lays 2-3 eggs per year. (By the way, eagles do not "mate in the air.")
→ Eagles have yellow beaks, eyes and talons, and they wear feather

"shorts" on their legs because they swoop down on the water to catch fish, their favorite food.


