Don Welvaert, Mayor of Moline

Moline Mayor Don Welvaert will be our scheduled speaker at the April 16 meeting so please plan to attend.

Mayor Welvaert is participating in the Bettendorf Rotary's series of programs designed to expose our members to the Mayors of the Quad Cities.

The former Moline Alderman campaigned for Mayor on a platform of balanced progress, and creating and

retaining jobs in the QC. Earlier this month the Mayor remarked at the Quad-City Chamber of Commerce Federation's Leadership Academy, that his two highest priorities are bringing passenger rail service to the Quad Cities, and construction of the Quad-City campus of Western Illinois University. Mayor Welvaert was part of a delegation to Springfield, Illinois to lobby for funding for that campus project.

A strong proponent of development in Moline, the Mayor also is an advocate for cooperation among all governmental entities in the Quad Cities. He is on record as supporting organizations like the Quad-City Development Group, and is a supporter of business and civic successes in the entire region.

Rick Best, general manager of WQPT





Rick made a point to remind us about an upcoming TV program called "Carrier", set to aire the end of April. The program is a 10-hour series shown over five nights. A film crew was embedded on the USS Nimitz Carrier ship for 17 months and documented the lives of 16 sailors. (See details below)



Rick gave an interesting talk on the switch to Digital TV on February 17, 2009. Bottom line is be smart and be prepared for the switch from analog.
