# Learn all about Dist. 6000's FAMSCO...

FAMSCO (Fire and Medical Supply Co.) was founded 20 years ago by Rotarians of District 6000 for humanitarian purposes. Its president, Iowa City Rotarian **Karin Franklin**, is the guest speaker at our Oct. 27 meeting.

FAMSCO accepts medical and firefighting equipment (including fire trucks) and supplies to be used by needy communities in developing countries, its Website, <a href="https://www.famsco.org">www.famsco.org</a>, says.

To meet these needs, FAMSCO partners with Rotarians abroad, who accept the shipped materials and make sure they get to the communities or institutions that need them. To acquire donated supplies, equipment and usable vehicles in the U.S., the organization works with hospitals, clinics, fire departments, ambulance services and others who would be willing to donate such materials.

Karin was director of Iowa City's Department of Planning and Community Development for nearly 20 years.

# Fascinating facts about human spine

First, there was the spine model on the table. Then there were the toys. Finally, he handed out Oreos and marshmallows – all to teach us about the human spine.

And our guest speaker at the Oct. 20 meeting – **David Wilder**, associate professor of biomedical engineering and associate professor of occupational and environmental health at the University of Iowa – did just that. He's also a faculty member at Palmer College of Chiropractic.

Using all those props, David discussed all the engineering problems that can plague



the spine. For example, subjected to long-term downward force, the spine, like one of his toys, can collapse because of long-column buckling. The

**Oreo-marshmallow-Oreo "sandwich"** was an effective way to illustrate what can happen to one spinal disk... until people started eating their visual aids.

Amid all the fun, David made some serious points about back health: Sitting, because of the way it stretches one side of the spine and compresses the opposite side, leads to lumbar-region pain. The jolts and vibrations from simply riding in a car cause repetitive-motion type injuries.

His basic advice for good back health: "Be careful. Try to plan your movement – especially when the back is involved. Exercise. Maintain moderate weight."
