**'Bettendorf 101' –
how city works**

At the Aug. 1 meeting we learned the best way to find out what Bettendorf is all about from **Lauran Haldeman**, the city's public information officer. It's quite a journey. "Bettendorf 101: City Citizens Academy" is a 7-week program that provides an inside look at how the city of Bettendorf works.

Begun in the fall of 2008, "B-101" offers citizens of Bettendorf twice-yearly opportunities to take a detailed look at the city's services. The free program meets 6-9 p.m. on consecutive Thursdays, plus two bus trips. Haldeman outlined the contents of each session:



→The City Hall session gives an overview of City Council responsibilities and tours the Police Department and State Street Fire Station.

→At the Learning Campus, attendees tour the Family Museum (including playing with the exhibits) and the Public Library.

→A detailed Police Department session lets citizens learn about the equipment and procedures used by the Emergency Response Unit and the K-9 Unit.

→The Public Works visit acquaints participants with such mechanized services as the one-man pavement patcher, and recycling and trash-collection trucks.

→The Community Development Department visit provides insight into city planning, flood-plain usage and the operation of traffic lights.

→Visitors put their hands on fire-fighting gear when they tour the Surrey Heights Fire Station.

→The Saturday bus tour focuses on Economic Development, with a factory tour, and Parks & Recreation with stops at the dog park, a bike trail, Palmer Hills Golf Course and the Life Fitness Center.

→The Friday evening bus tour takes the class to the waste-water treatment plant, Scott County landfill and recycling center, the composting facility and the Scott Emergency Communication Center.

“Graduates” of the course receive a certificate and a gift during a dinner ceremony. For more information, or to sign up, contact Haldeman at 344-4033 or lhaldeman@bettendorf.org. the next available session begins April 4, 2013. Class size is limited to 30.
