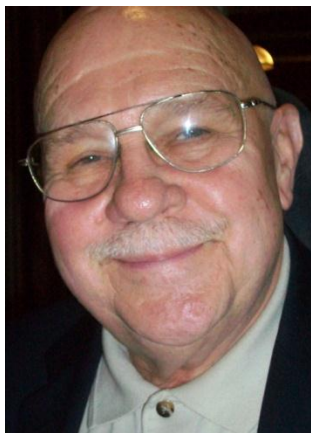

**Run with Carl countdown
gets serious next week**



Next week our own **Dick Schillig** takes over the meeting to bring us up to date on plans for the 18th annual Run with Carl on Labor Day, Sept. 2, and to

introduce this year's scholarship winners from Pleasant Valley and Bettendorf high schools.

The Carl D. Schillig Memorial Fund annually provides a four-year, \$4,000 scholarship to one graduate each from Bettendorf's two high schools. The fund currently funds the studies of recipients who are attending Drake University, Iowa State University, St. Ambrose University, Luther College and Coe College.

Run with Carl first stepped off in 1995. In 2005, Bettendorf Rotary became the Run with Carl title sponsor.

**An inside look at
Genesis Systems**

Genesis Systems Group – located in Davenport – is a world-leading robotic systems integrator. “We’re not a robotics manufacturer,” explained **Joel Lorentzen**, its president and CEO at the May 22 meeting. “We travel the world doing the very difficult work” of applying robots to manufacturing – “often, for very demanding clients.”

Founded in 1983 – Joel joined two years later – Genesis now works in an amazing diversity of industries. Last year – when the



company did \$56 million worth of business – it helped companies in agricultural manufacturing; automotive markets; passenger railcar manufacturing (recently including the Rochelle, Ill., plant of Nippon Sharyo, which is making cars that eventually Quad Citians will ride to Chicago); tractor-trailer rigs; and aerospace companies Boeing and SpaceX. “Interesting how far we reach,” Joel said. “SpaceX is coming to Davenport, Iowa,” for this technology.

Besides outer space, many of the 100-plus employees of Genesis Systems can find themselves working in Asia, Europe or Latin America, as well as the U.S., at U.S. plants of foreign companies; at foreign-company plants in third countries, such as a Japanese company's plants in India or Brazil; or as a joint-venture partner with a foreign company on its own soil. Genesis has a full-service travel-agency branch in-house to support all that travel.

"The Quad Cities is the perfect place for a company like ours," Joel said. "Our people are the best in the world at what they do." As proof of that point, he added, "Genesis Systems owns 32 patents. That comes from the passion of our people."
