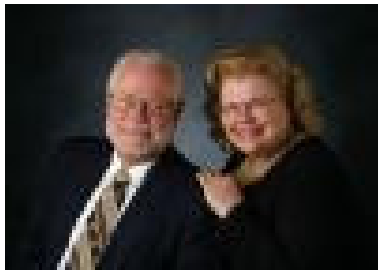

Chuck Long talks about grid career

Now entering his 50s and starting a new
career as a business development
executive with Holmes Murphy, the Des
Moines-based independent insurance
brokerage firm, former Iowa Hawkeye
quarterback **Chuck Long** entertained an
appreciative audience at the March 19
meeting with tales of his collegiate and
professional football careers.



“I probably wouldn’t be recruited today,” Long said as he described how legendary Iowa coach Hayden Fry recruited him after he had led his Wheaton, Ill., high school team to a state

championship. Calling himself “a skinny, 170-lb. kid” who had completed just one pass and run “for minus 3 yards” in the game, Chuck at first thought the call from an Iowa assistant coach inviting him to campus was a prank. And his father didn’t believe he had been extended a full-ride scholarship until he had actually talked with Fry on the phone.

Saying he joined the Iowa football program “at just the right time” as Fry was building his program, Chuck described two of his favorite games as quarterback: beating Michigan 12-10 in the 1985 season – “the thrill and euphoria of the crowd after that (game-winning) field goal (as time expired) – and running a bootleg into the end zone to defeat



Michigan State. Before that play, Chuck said, Fry had called him to the sideline and told him to fake a handoff to running back Ronnie Harmon and then sweep

around end. When Chuck started to question Fry, “he told me, ‘Just do it and we’re going to win’. We did.”

In a casual presentation, Chuck also summarized his 7-year career in the NFL and 16 years coaching at the collegiate level. He was head coach at San Diego State and an assistant at Iowa and Oklahoma. “The atmosphere there is a lot different level than at Iowa,” he said. After the Sooners lost only the second home game during his tenure, he said “House for Sale” signs appeared on his front lawn – and those of the entire coaching staff.

Chuck described his first QB start as a pro – for the Detroit Lions, against Chicago the year after the Bears won the Super Bowl. On the first play, defensive end Richard Dent and defensive tackle Dan Hampton sacked him. After the play, “Hampton reached down to help me up,” Chuck said. “Defensive linemen never do that... As I stood up, he said, ‘I just want you to know it’s nothing personal – but we’re going to do this to you all night’.”

➔ **Celebrating 25 years of women in Rotary:** “Women were first admitted into Rotary membership 25 years ago,”

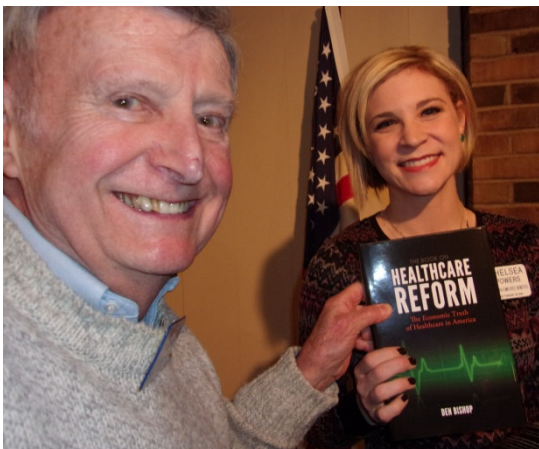

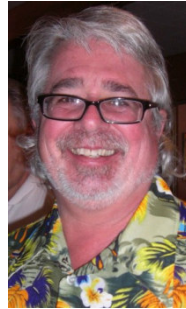
