An update on Palmer College of Chiropractic

Dr. Dennis Marchiori, chancellor of Palmer College of Chiropractic, is the scheduled speaker for the Sept. 24 meeting – at the Davenport Country Club, as it was last week.

D.D. Palmer performed his first adjustments in 1895 in Davenport, and



the Palmer School and Cure was founded in 1897. It was later renamed the Palmer School of Chiropractic. Palmer College –

which also has campuses in San Jose, Calif., and Port Orange, Fla. – teaches practitioners from around the world.

Chiropractic is a form of health care that uses spinal adjustments to correct slight misalignments, which it says can cause health problems because they interrupt the normal function of the nervous system.

Foundation fights ovarian cancer

September is National Ovarian Cancer Month, said **Jodie Kavensky** of the Norma-Leah Ovarian Cancer Foundation, the featured speaker at the Sept. 17 meeting. The cancer strikes one in 72 women, she said, "and 70 percent of them die within five years" of diagnosis.

Jodie founded the Norma-Leah Ovarian Cancer Foundation – named for her mother and aunt, who both died of the disease – specifically to create public awareness, promote early detection and support research for ovarian cancer.

Because ovaries are located deep within a woman's pelvis – and its symptoms are extremely subtle, so may be ignored for a long time – ovarian cancer often reaches an advanced stage before being detected. Jodie advised women with a family history of the cancer to consult a doctor if they experience persistent "BEAT" symptoms for several weeks:

- →**B**loating that is persistent
- →Eating less, feeling fuller
- → Abdominal and/or back pain
- → Trouble with bladder and bowels.

No early-detection test exists to identify



the presence of ovarian cancer, **Jodie** said. And it's not possible to feel a tumor as one might to discover the presence of breast cancer. Often, she said, it may be necessary to have a trans-vaginal

ultrasound to diagnose the presence of an ovarian tumor.

Ovarian cancer is most prevalent among – although not limited to – women with Eastern European heritage, especially Jewish families, Jodie said. Women who experience infertility or endometriosis have a higher risk, she added. And removal of the ovaries does not completely reduce the risk.

Beginning in the Quad-Cities, the Norma-Leah Foundation now distributes "BEAT the Big O" cards nationally as part of the awareness campaign. Ovarian cancer organizations have adopted the color teal for survivors and others affected by the disease. Fund raising includes the sale of teal-colored jewelry, such as the pendant that Jodie and two other women associated with the Foundation – Jane Fleming and Sammie Smith – wore at the meeting.
