**Jobs network key
help for victims**

Because economic abuse – controlling a victim’s financial resources – is the main barrier that prevents a victim of domestic abuse from escaping, Family Resources introduced the Employer Network for Survivors as an aspect of its SafePath Survivor Resources, said **Nicole Cisne Durbin**, the program’s director.

Domestic abusers often control financial resources to control their victims, Nicole explained. It could take many forms, she said, from simply making a spouse quit a job to stay home with the children to secretly ruining a woman’s credit rating.

Rotarians can help sexual and domestic abuse victims break away from their abuser, she said at the Jan. 14 meeting, by becoming involved in the Employer Network. Her agency serves women, predominantly, with all levels of experience and education, she emphasized, “and they all need jobs.” Rotarians can help, she added:

- if you have a job opening,
- if you know of a job opening in another company,
- by helping spread awareness of the need for hiring abuse victims.



SafePath Survivor Resources provides services for victims of domestic violence and sexual assault in Scott, Clinton, Jackson, Louisa and Rock Island counties, Nicole said. It operates a 54-bed shelter and offers such other free and confidential services as:

- Emergency crisis response...
- Individual and group counseling...
- Counseling for “non-offending significant others and families”...
- Advocacy and support during evidence collection...
- Legal and medical advocacy...

... For any woman, child or man who has been victimized, she said.

During 2014 the agency served more than 6,000 individual clients, in response to more than 5,600 crisis calls, Nicole said.

History with Harry... (Harry Coin looks through BRC archives to discover what the club was doing in years past...)

Among the few thousand pages of BRC minutes I scanned in was a brochure, "Bettendorf Rotary 1957-1980." That was the first effort I could find our club

made to assess, condense then present our history. I can barely feature a small slice of a few meetings in one of my talks but these folks are from "the greatest generation" – they dust off 23 years in a few pages!

The spirit of the club has stayed much the same as it was when John Freund said in his preface: "Fellowship, friendship and the interaction among members are the forces that make Rotary run."

Our closeness with local education, including valued members working as headmasters and public school officials, began at our founding with Bettendorf High School Principal Bob Owens. In 1959, today's multi-decade members **Tim Downing** and **Jim Slavens** were at that time student guests.

Our club always had a lighthearted character. When a meeting's featured speaker canceled on then president Ken Horstmann, he introduced the last-minute replacement with: "After scraping the bottom of the barrel for today's program we have..." Ouch! In the 1960s a member said: "Where else can you get a piece of cake and a birthday song for a dollar?"

Among all the pages of history in the brochure, the short quote that stood out in my mind was: "It is the policy of Rotary to lend its help and co-operation to worthy enterprises through the participation of its members as individuals. Although Rotary is not a charitable institution, financial aid is frequently given.... The commitment to service and square dealing with customers, fellow citizens and community is the glue that binds Rotarians and Rotary clubs throughout the world."

And that WAS the news!!
