Sport puts Bettendorf's fire chief on ice

Bettendorf Fire Chief **Gerry Voelliger** carries on a family tradition, following his father and grandfather as head of the BFD. But when he visits Bettendorf Rotary on Feb. 18 he'll share his passion

for a totally opposite activity – ice climbing.

BFD chief since 1990, Gerry in his time off follows the call of the outdoors. An avid rock free-climber, he has added ice climbing. His conquests include waterfalls in Wisconsin, Illinois and Colorado. He'll talk about how much the Midwest offers for that sport.

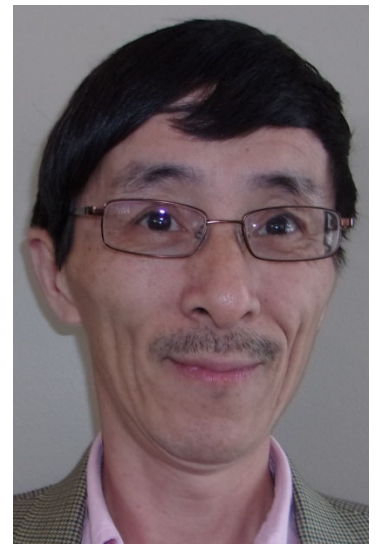
His rock-climbing has taken him to many of Colorado's 14 highest peaks, Mt. Rainier and "the hardest adventure race in history," he says: the 10-day, 500-mile 2006 Primal Quest in Utah in July. He finished in 32nd place, "the highest position of all non professional teams."

Dancers revive Chinese culture

Shen Yun, a touring troupe of dancers and musicians, celebrates 5,000 years of the culture of the Chinese civilization. The 2½-hour show is scheduled to perform Tuesday and Wednesday, Feb. 17-18, at Davenport's Adler Theater. **Hao Feng**, associate professor of food and bioprocess engineering at the University of Illinois, spoke about Shen Yun at the Feb. 11 meeting. Tickets for the performances are available at shenyun.com.





Although the current Chinese regime, which took over the country in 1949, systematically destroyed many historic and cultural sites, Hao Feng said Shen Yun is reviving aspects of pre-communist China through its music and traditional ballet. Feng spoke about many of the distinctive characteristics of Chinese ballet, including:

- The similarities of bodily movement used by both Chinese ballet and martial arts
- The acrobatic nature of Chinese dance
- The bearing of dancers, “so expressive, revealing their inner beauty,” Feng said
- The telling of stories that illustrate virtues of Chinese culture and tradition using dance – Feng mentioned the story of Mu-lan, adapted into a Disney feature-length cartoon, which emphasized the virtues of loyalty to country and respect for parents

Feng’s wife, **Ying-qi Chen** of Shen Yun, accompanied her

husband. Shen Yun was formed in the U.S. in 2006 by artists and musicians who left China and wanted to preserve ancient cultural forms, Feng explained.

In addition to the colorful costumes and traditional dances, Shen Yun uses elaborate digital backdrops to accent performances. Traditional Chinese instruments are added to the Shen Yun orchestra of Western instruments.

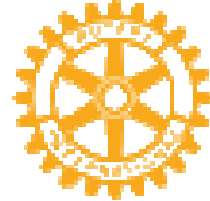
