## Fire chief scales sheer ice for fun

Bettendorf Fire Chief **Gerry Voelliger** keeps himself in motion: "The more you sit still, the less you are able to move," he says, adding, "Life's more fun when you move."

And move he does – up and down frozen waterfalls. To keep himself in top condition to move this way, every day he does pushups, pull-ups and sit-ups – 100 of each – at age 60.

Gerry has developed a friendship with Canadian ice climber Will Gadd, who climbs such landmarks as Niagara Falls – he showed a video of Gadd scaling that frozen cataract with the water falling mere feet away. Meanwhile, Gerry does most of his climbing within a 2-hour drive of the QC, at such waterfalls as Illinois' Starved Rock State Park: "There's nothing more beautiful than climbing on ice with rushing water beside you," he said.

He also veers away from natural waterfalls occasionally: he was part of a group that scaled an 80-ft.-high corn silo outside Cedar Falls, Iowa, where 58,000 gallons of water and an Iowa winter had turned that agricultural icon into a category-5 (out of 7) ice climb. That rating was because of "its vertical-ness," he told a reporter for Al Jazeera America, which broadcast a feature on the climb.

In addition to showing videos of ice



climbing —
including Ourey,
Colo., dubbed "the
ice-climbing
capital of the U.S."
— Gerry explained
the equipment he
uses and the
protective clothing
he wears during a
climb. The helmet

is the most important item, he said, because chunks of ice fall continually during a climb. Typically, he wears 5 layers above the waist, from a perspiration-repelling inner shirt to a rain slicker, and 3 layers of leggings, from long underwear to waterproof trousers.

Each piece of equipment is unique to ice

climbing, Gerry explained. The **rope** is waterproof and stretches 8% to slow a fall. **Picks** are designed to dig in and hold onto ice. Shoe-mounted **crampons** help him "walk" up vertical ice. Ice screws, which can quickly burrow into solid ice, provide a margin of safety at intervals along the climb.



To underscore the need to be safety-alert every moment of a climb, Gerry shared his "final thoughts," including: "The positive power of

negative thinking" – in which he is always aware of the unintended bad consequences of each move he makes. He also emphasized the need to "do the simple things – right," explaining it's those simple moves, executed correctly, that keep him safe.

In the end, he advised, "Stop and enjoy the view" (whether climbing ice or just taking a walk in nature).
