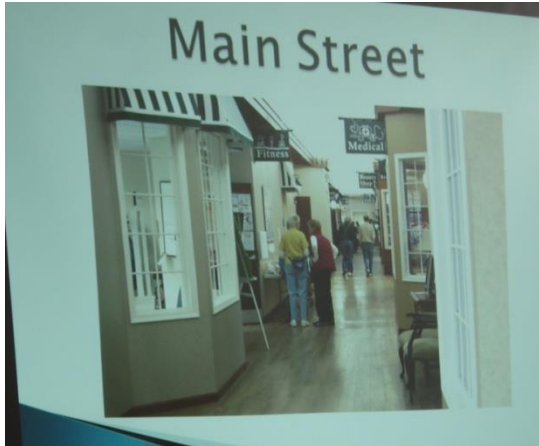

CASI = activity while aging

CASI – or the Center for Active Seniors Inc. – exists with a long list of services to deliver on the promise in its name: help people stay active while they're aging.

That was the core message delivered at the July 22 meeting by **Laura Kopp**, president/CEO of CASI. From its earliest days – it was established in 1973 – the agency has worked to establish itself as "a one-stop shop or marketplace where seniors could access the services, resources and activities they need all in one place," she said.



That list of services includes fitness, health, beauty... and many others with transportation when needed to reach services not provided in CASI's "Main Street shops."

CASI services rest on four pillars, Laura said:

- **Socialization:** Resting on research that suggests "older adults who have strong social networks seem to have a higher quality of life, live longer and are healthier..." CASI operates such diverse services as a library, Eleanor's Café, regular bingo games and a billiards room
- **Health and wellness:** To promote age-appropriate levels of fitness, CASI equips a fitness center, offers regular blood



pressure and vision checks, marks an indoor walking track at its 1035 W.

Kimberly Road facility in Davenport and organizes fitness support groups

→ **Advocacy:** With its staff of about 30 paid and "hundreds of volunteers," CASI advocates for its members when they deal with all sorts of issues, such as landlords, Medicaid officials, personal budgeting, legal matters... and it's all free, Laura emphasized. "Why?" she asked, "Because one in four QC adults will be over age 60 by the year 2025."

→ **Intensive (support) services:** Two services – a congregate meal site and "Jane's Place" adult daycare – help CASI members stretch their resources and stay in their own homes, Laura explained. The meal site has served some 9,000 meals so far in 2015. With care especially for persons with dementia or Alzheimer's, she said, CASI can help members or provide a respite for an in-home care giver at a fraction of the cost of assisted-living care, home nursing or a residential nursing facility.

After the strains of Ferrell's "Because I'm Happy" sounded in the room, **Vice President Sharon Sarver** collected **\$199**



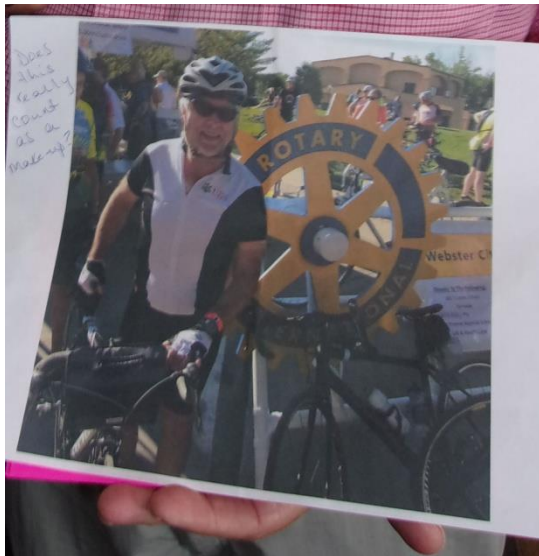
– especially from **Paul Scranton** – thanks for supporting the John Deere Classic + “this lays to rest the idea that you can't do well at both the JDC and
