WHBF general manager to speak Feb. 10

The scheduled speaker for our Feb. 10 meeting is **Marshall Porter**, vice president and general manager of WHBF-TV, Rock Island since 2008.

Marshall also held the post in 1996-2000, after serving two years as general sales manager for WQAD-TV, Moline. Between his times at WHBF, Marshall held sales and management positions at stations in Des Moines, Iowa; Madison, Wis., and Rockford, Ill.

Since 2013, WHBF has been owned by Nexstar Broadcasting Group. The station signed on in July 1950, the 5th station in Illinois and the first outside Chicago.

A look inside BPD crime detection

Officer **Tim Doty**, chief evidence technician and head of identification, property and evidence with the Bettendorf Police Department, revealed some interesting facts about crime investigation at the Feb. 3 meeting.

Tim supervises 16 evidence technicians – most of whom are also patrol officers – who collect evidence at crime scenes and take it to Police Headquarters, where he stores it for further processing, analysis or use in court. The most common crime committed in Bettendorf is burglary, he said. Tim himself works the crime scenes where a death occurs, he added.

Unlike the scenes in CSI: or other television crime-detection programs, when Tim analyzes fingerprints from a crime scene a suspect's photo does not appear on screen after a few seconds. To process a fingerprint, Tim first examines it to ensure it is clear enough to be analyzed further. If it is useable, he enters it into a series of databases – Scott County prints from crime investigations, then similar databases for Rock Island County, the entire U.S. and suspected terrorists. Those several databases contain more than 10 million prints.

When the computers have identified likely matching prints, “it still takes a human to verify a match,” Tim said, “and that’s me.” To check his work, Tim asks the evidence chief in the Rock Island

Police Department to make the same comparisons – and Tim backstops his Rock Island colleague in return.

If drugs are involved in a crime, Tim does chemical tests to determine whether the substance is marijuana. If any other drug is involved, the samples are sent to the

Iowa Department of Criminal Investigation lab in Ankeny for analysis.

Money confiscated from crime scenes goes through a multi-step accounting process before being deposited, or used as trial evidence. If the trial results in a conviction, confiscated funds go to pay fines or restitution to victims. In cases with no finding of guilt, Tim returns the money to the owner.

Confiscated property follows a similar pathway, he added.

Tuesday, Feb. 23, at City Hall. "We want to create a sense of place" downtown, Mayor Bob said – and he invited citizen input.

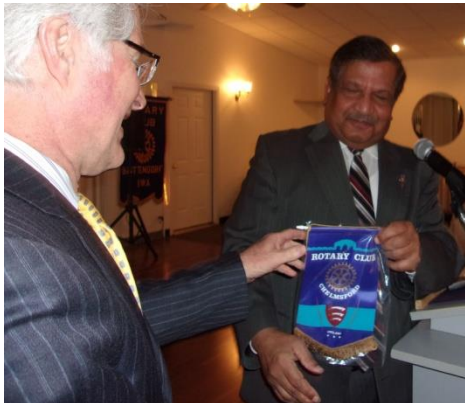
